Florida Gators Frontcourt Report: #3 Micah Handlogten vs. #9 Rueben Chinyelu

The Florida Gators utilize a rotation of interior players to anchor their defense and control the glass. Based on the current statistical data for the 6 games analyzed, here is a detailed breakdown of **#3 Micah Handlogten** and **#9 Rueben Chinyelu**, two vital components of the Gators' frontcourt strategy.




#3 Micah Handlogten

Position: Forward/Center
Minutes Per Game: 11:06
Efficiency Rating (Off. Rtg): 129.4

Handlogten serves as a highly efficient, low-usage interior finisher. While his scoring average is modest at 2.7 PPG, his value lies in his offensive rebounding and efficiency at the rim.

- Rim Finishing:** Handlogten is a specialist at the rim (ATR), with 100% of his field goal attempts coming from this area. He connects on 57.1% of his shots at the basket.
- Rebounding Prowess:** Despite playing limited minutes, he posts an elite Rebound Percentage of 18.8%. He is particularly active on the offensive glass, recording 11 offensive rebounds compared to 10 on the defensive end.
- Low Mistake Player:** He maintains a strong 2.67 Assist-to-Turnover ratio, showing excellent decision-making for a big man in limited touches.



#9 Rueben Chinyelu

Position: Forward/Center
Minutes Per Game: 17:40
Total Rebounds: 42

Chinyelu provides more volume in the frontcourt rotation, playing roughly six more minutes per game than Handlogten. He is the more physical presence, leading the two in scoring and total rebounding.

- Interior Scoring:** Averaging 5.3 PPG, Chinyelu is active in the paint. He shoots 54.2% from the field, with the majority of his looks coming "At The Rim" (17 attempts).
- Glass Eater:** Chinyelu is one of the team's most dominant rebounders, boasting a 21.4% Rebound Percentage. His 29 defensive rebounds are crucial for ending opponent possessions.
- Physicality and Fouls:** Chinyelu's aggressive style leads to more fouls (14 total) and technical fouls (2), but he also generates more free throw trips (5 trips, 60% shooting) than Handlogten.

Strategic Overview

While **#9 Chinyelu** provides a higher volume of rebounds and points, **#3 Handlogten** currently holds a superior **Net PPP (Points Per Possession)** of +0.23, compared to Chinyelu's -0.02. This suggests that while Chinyelu plays more minutes and compiles higher counting stats, the team operates slightly more efficiently during Handlogten's limited shifts.

Both players are essential for the Gators' fast-paced identity (Team Pace: 17.37). They act as "glass cleaners" who allow guards like Walter Clayton (#1) to focus on high-volume scoring. Neither player stretches the floor (0 combined three-point attempts), keeping the Gators' offensive interior gravity focused strictly within the paint.
